WHAT I SEE...

When I look at the faces of people at our YMCAs, I'm always humbled by what I see. Determination, passion, wisdom, trust and strength are written in the expressions of YMCA volunteers, participants and members across our diverse communities. The YMCA weaves together people from many different backgrounds and cultures, and yet these emotions always shine through. This is what binds us together as Canadians, and I am thrilled that our YMCA has a role to play in strengthening our sense of community.

Our Strategic Plan, entitled Growing Stronger Together 2008-2012, challenged the partnership of YMCA staff and volunteers to lead our YMCAs to do more, for more people, in more communities across Southwestern Ontario. The Plan challenged us to create the human, intellectual, financial, and material resources needed to sustain the work of our YMCAs for generations to come.

We have accepted the challenge to become leaders in the lives of those children, adults and families who call on their YMCA day after day. In 2008 we made significant steps forward, with the first full year of operating the Lambton Shores YMCA Wellness Centre, renovating our Jerry McCaw Branch in Sarnia, and signing a 5-year extension to our operating agreement with the municipality of Goderich.

We also introduced more people to the YMCA in their community. We opened the Urban Aboriginal Childcare Centre in Sarnia, put plans in motion for the design and development of our new Chatham-Kent YMCA facility, and launched career counselling centres in Chatham and Petrolia. These initiatives make the YMCA

more viable and available within our communities, and enable us to meet emerging community needs.

Our work with our hundreds of donors and partners in 2008 highlighted the individual stories of strength and growth that are so important to our community. Donations by individuals and partners laid the groundwork to assist in access for over 4,000 people through our YMCA Strong Kids Campaign, and by collaborating in a vision with our partners at the Sarnia Community Foundation we created a YMCA Legacy Fund that will continue to be a positive force for good in that community.

From where I sit, I see the hard work of our dedicated staff and volunteers each day. I'm pleased to be able to show you what we've been about in 2008. Take a look...

Your YMCA communities are committed to helping all individuals, children, families and seniors reach their full potential.

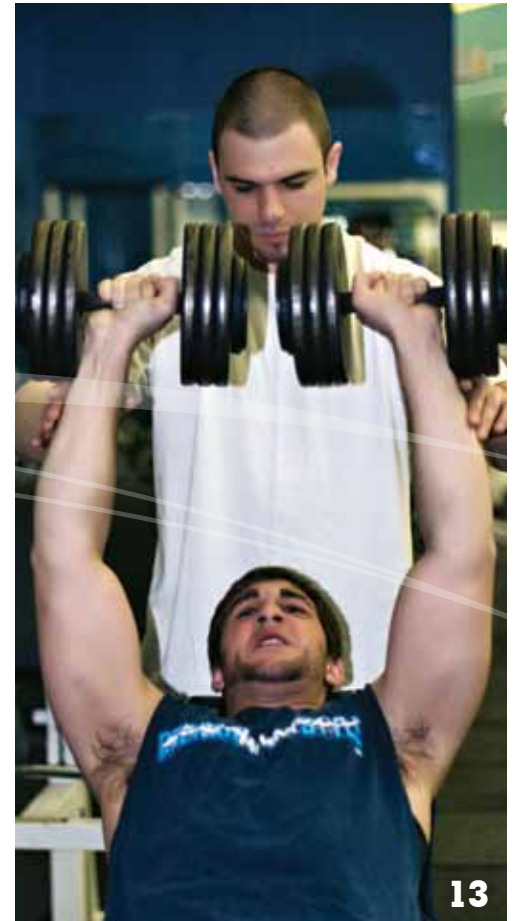

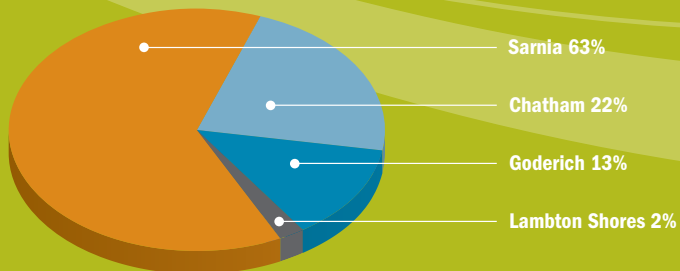

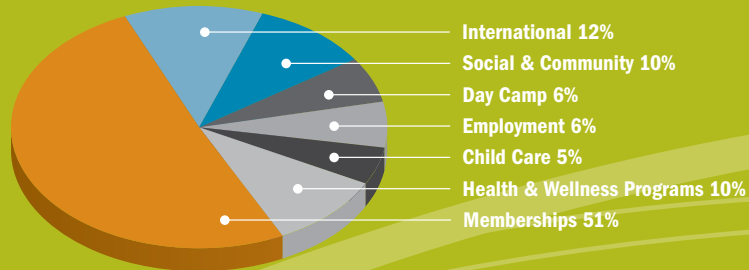

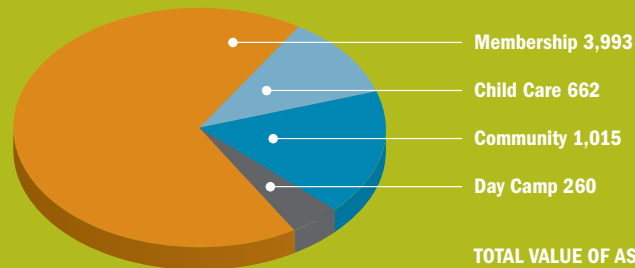
